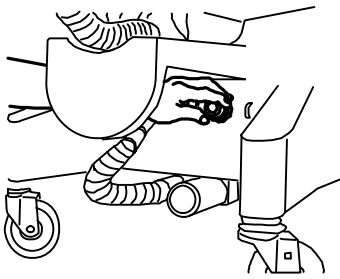

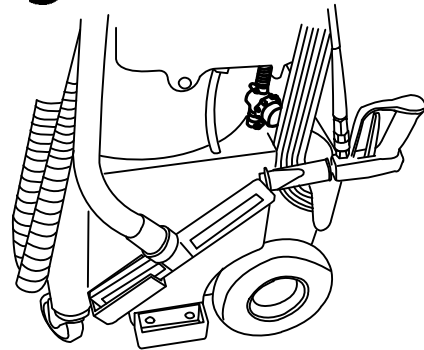

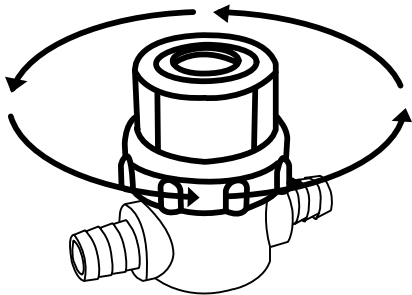
Filter Screen Cleaning Procedure



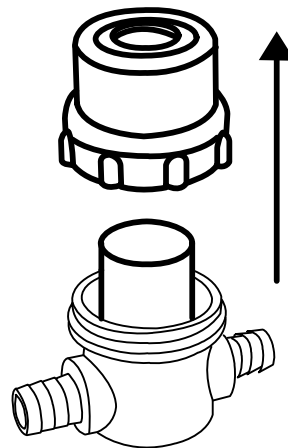
KaiVac filter is located on the base below the vac hose wrap on front of machine.



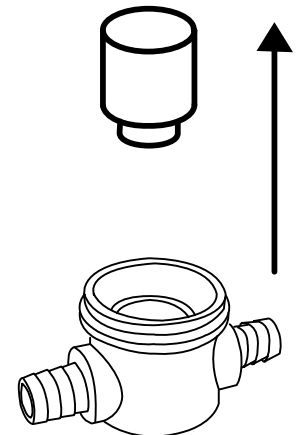
KaiZen filter is located on the left side of machine between water supply tank and the hood assembly.



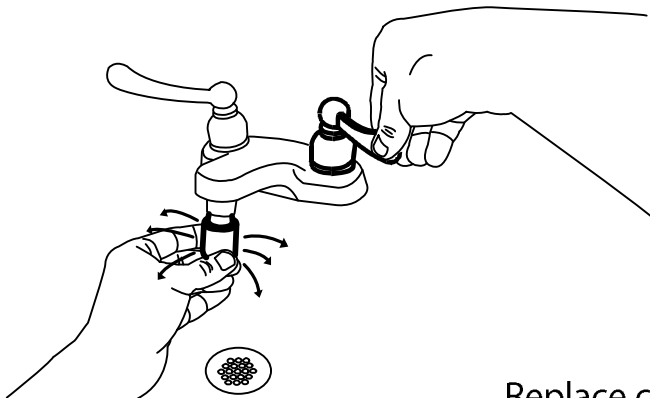
Rotate bowl cover counterclockwise to remove.



Lift bowl cover up and remove.



Pull filter up and out.



Place filter screen with the open end up against spout of sink fixture or water source and turn on the water flushing debris from the inside out. Continue flushing until water flows freely thru filter. Filter is clean if one can blow freely thru it.

Replace cleaned filter reversing the procedure above. If filter cannot be cleaned replace with new one.

DO NOT OPERATE MACHINE WITHOUT FILTER.

Winterize your Kaivac Equipment

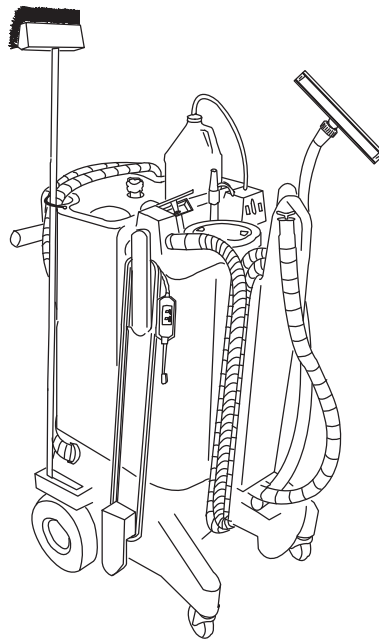
Your Kaivac machinery should be winterized between uses if it is to be exposed to freezing temperatures. To winterize your machine, pour 1/2 gallon of windshield wiper fluid into the empty water tank. Aim the spray gun into the water tank. Run the pump and spray the gun until the fluid begins running through.

SECTION 1

Introduction

INSPECTION

Carefully unpack and inspect your new KaiVac cleaning machine for shipping damage. Each unit is tested and thoroughly inspected before shipping. For instructions regarding any shipping damage, contact KaiVac immediately. All returns must have a Return Authorization Number (RAN).

WARNINGS

- **DO NOT** operate with a frayed, worn or damaged cord.
- **DO NOT** use to pick up flammable or combustible materials.
- **DO NOT** run the pump without water in the water tank or without filter.
- **DO NOT** use hot water.

GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS

THE KAI VAC MUST BE GROUNDED. If it should malfunction or stop working, grounding provides a path of least resistance for electrical current, thereby reducing the risk of electrical shock. The KaiVac is also supplied with a ground fault circuit interruptor (GFCI) to reduce danger of electric shock. It must be maintained and tested regularly. This unit is equipped with a cord that has an equipment grounding conductor and a grounding plug. The plug must be inserted in an appropriate outlet that is properly installed and grounded in accordance with all local codes and ordinances. Cutting off the ground wire or using a cord that is not equipped with a ground plug will void the warranty on the unit, and KaiVac will accept NO responsibility associated with the unit.

Improper connection of the equipment grounding connector conductor can result in a risk of electrical shock. Check with a qualified electrician or service person if you doubt the outlet is properly grounded. Do not modify the plug provided with the KaiVac. If it will not fit the outlet, have a proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician.

Safety Precautions

- **Equipment Warning**
 - Read all instructions to ensure safe operation of the KaiVac.
- **Training**
 - Proper training is required before using the KaiVac. Contact your authorized KaiVac distributor for training information.
 - Instruction placards are attached to each KaiVac and should not be removed. These placards show proper cleaning procedures and safety precautions.
- **Equipment Use**
 - Do not use the equipment in a manner that it was not intended for by the manufacturer.
 - See S-I-M-P-L-E Operation section for proper use of the equipment.
- **Spray Gun**
 - Never point the spray gun at people.
- **Prevention of Electrocutation –**
 - Use the ground fault circuit interruptor (GFCI) with the KaiVac at all times.
 - Test the GFCI before each use.
 - Do not spray liquid from the KaiVac onto electrical outlets or on any electrical devices.
- **Personal Protection –**
 - Wear gloves, eye protection and ear protection when operating the KaiVac.
- **Prevention of Water Damage to Buildings**
 - The KaiVac is to be used on water-resistant building surfaces only. These include concrete, terrazzo, ceramic tile and quarry tile.
 - The KaiVac may be used for stripping on vinyl-composite tile floors, but daily cleaning of resilient flooring using the KaiVac is not recommended.
 - Never overflow the water tank or the vacuum recovery tank.
 - Discontinue use if any leaks occur in the KaiVac.

CAUTION: Prior to cleaning, always inspect area to ensure that the surfaces to be cleaned are water-safe. In addition, check for poor construction, damaged walls and floors, missing or damaged tiles or grout, missing or insufficient caulk, and loose wall coverings. If problems are discovered, resolve them prior to cleaning in order to avoid any harm that may result from exposure to water or cleaning solution.

- **Chemical Use**

- Only use chemicals approved for use with the KaiVac. Use of non-Kaivac Will reduce warranty and may cause machine damage.
- Turn Chemical line off when not in use.
- Keep the appropriate chemical MSDS sheets on hand at all times.
- Cleaning chemicals should not be put in the water tank (with the exception of KaiDri in small amounts). Cleaning chemicals in the water tank can cause operator harm and machine damage because of the following:
 - Chemicals in the water tank must pass through the pump which may cause premature pump failure. Use of chemicals in the water tank voids the warranty.
 - Chemicals in the water tank will be aerosolized and may harm the operator.

- **Electrical**

- Do not pull the KaiVac by the cord or use the cord as a handle. Do not close a door on the cord or pull the cord around sharp edges or corners. Do not run over the cord. Keep the cord away from heated surfaces.
- DO NOT pull on the cord to unplug. Grasp the plug at the outlet and pull.
- Turn off the unit before unplugging.
- Connect to a properly grounded outlet only.

- **Machine Integrity**

- Do not run the pump dry. This will void the machine warranty.
- Do not run hot water through the pump. This can cause pump cavitation and will void the warranty.
- Always be sure the water tank and water line filters are clear of debris. Running the pump with clogged filters can cause pump damage.
- Replace any damaged cords before use.
- Replace any damaged hoses before use.

Violation of any of these instructions may void any and all warranties

Limited Warranty Protection Plan

The KaiVac has been engineered and tested to provide long lasting performance. This warranty covers defects in workmanship or materials under normal use and service from the date of purchase.

Kaivac warrants the following components to be free from defects in materials and workmanship for these time periods:

1.) KaiChem Warranty for end users who use only Kaivac chemicals for the life of the machine.

- 5 years on rotationally molded parts.
- 3 years on other parts (excluding wear items)
- 1 year on labor

2.) Standard Warranty (When Kaivac chemicals not used)

- 1 year parts and labor

All Kaivac replacement parts are guaranteed for 90 days from the date of installation. Normal wear items such as wheels, hoses, seals, gaskets, cords, casters, squeegees and GFCI are excluded from warranty coverage.

All warranty claims must be accompanied by a Return Authorization Number (R.A.N.), which is available by calling the Kaivac Customer Service Department. No returns will be accepted without a R.A.N.

This warranty does not apply to return freight costs, damage or defect caused by accident, negligence, misuse, fire or repair done by anyone other than a Kaivac authorized repair center. In no event shall Kaivac, Incorporated be liable for incidental or consequential damages, or any damages to persons or property.

Please Note: Some states do not allow the exclusion or limitation of incidental or consequential damages. This warranty is in lieu of any other warranty expressed or implied, including any implied or merchantability for a particular purpose otherwise. Under no circumstances will the seller be liable for any loss, damage, expenses or consequential damages arising in connection with the use or inability to use seller's product. Kaivac, Incorporated reserves the right to make changes or improvements to its equipment without notice.

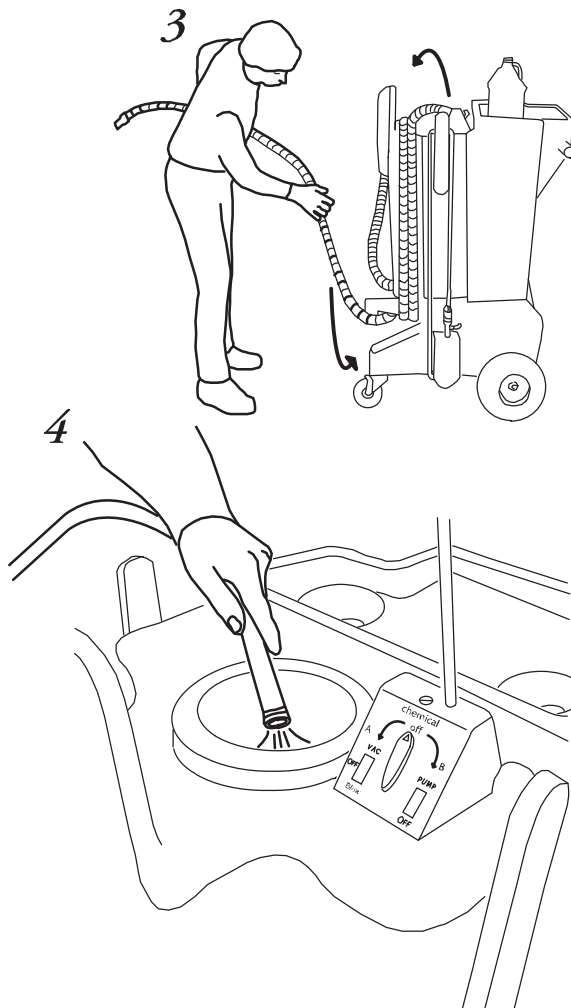
1. Unwrap vac hose and lay it on floor.
2. Suck water and air from water tank. Lower hose end to surface of water gulping both air and water. This action flushes soils from line and quickly empties water tank.



**Dry vac hose by connecting hose ends to vac motor, then discharge air into vac tank*



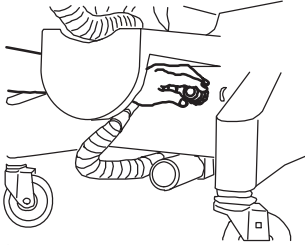
3. Vac hose can now be wrapped onto machine. Leave vac motor running while wrapping to avoid water dripping from end of hose. To completely dry hose leave vac motor running for about 3 minutes.
4. With Dump Hose opened to floor drain, spray inside of vac tank with clean water moving hose in a circular pattern to insure tank walls and float shutoff are rinsed.

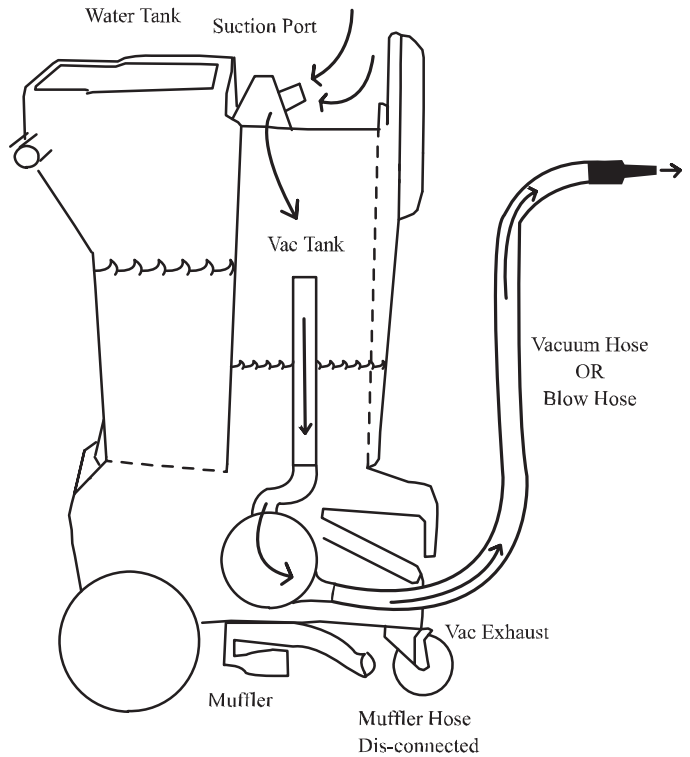

- Tables, chairs and equipment may be pressure washed to remove embedded soil.
- Walls and floors may be cleaned using the S-I-M-P-L-E system.



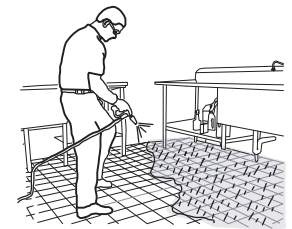
Locker and Shower Rooms

- Blow debris from in and under lockers, overhead fixtures and vents with the blow feature.
- Pressure wash and disinfect inside lockers.
- Use KaiBloey cleaner for delimiting shower rooms via chemical injection system.
- Use S-I-M-P-L-E procedures in other shower and locker room areas.



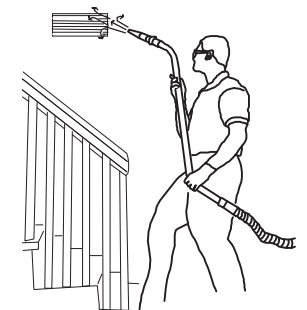
Stripping Floors

- Apply concentrated stripping solution using the chemical injection system. The chemical injection system will allow a 1:8 dilution ratio with no metering tip in place.
- Walk backwards while applying stripper to avoid stepping on wet surfaces.
- Scrub the floor with stripping pads or brushes.
- Wet-vac stripping solution from floor with the KaiVac squeegee tool.
- Use the spray gun and clean water from the water tank to rinse the floor an hard to reach areas as necessary. Turn the chemical valve to the "off" position to rinse the floor with water in low pressure mode.
- Blow the remaining stripper solution from behind baseboards, lockers and other hard to reach areas with the blow dry tool.
- Finally wet-vac rinse solution from the floor and touch up as needed.



Other Uses

- **High-Dusting** - Use air blast for cobweb and other dusting jobs.
- **Salt and water pickup** - Great for picking up water and salt during winter and rainy seasons.
- **Entrance Mat Cleaning** - Pressure wash and wet vac entry mats.
- **Window Cleaning** - Apply window washing solution with gun, squeegee window and wet vac off floor. Use only on compatible floors and walls.
- **Walls** - Use S-I-M-P-L-E process.
- **Stairwells** - Dust with air blast. Use S-I-M-P-L-E for deep cleaning.

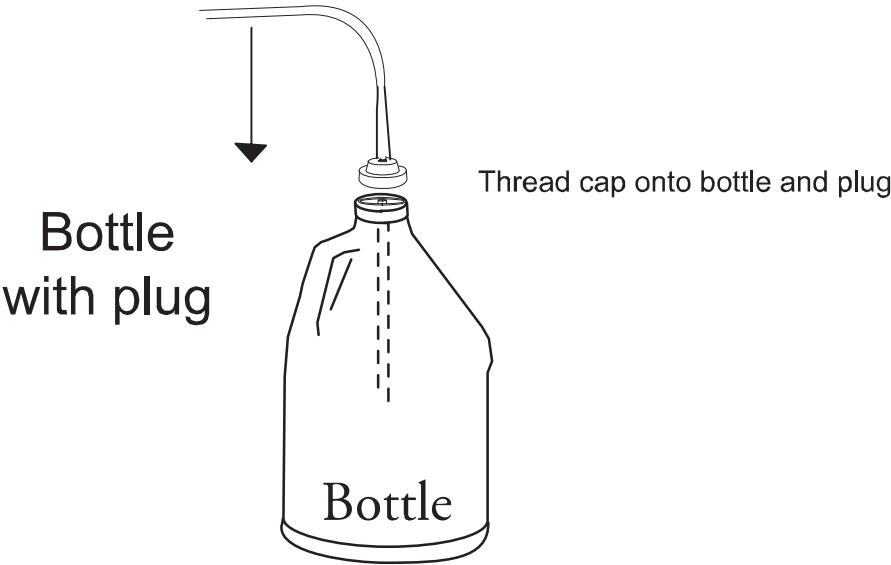
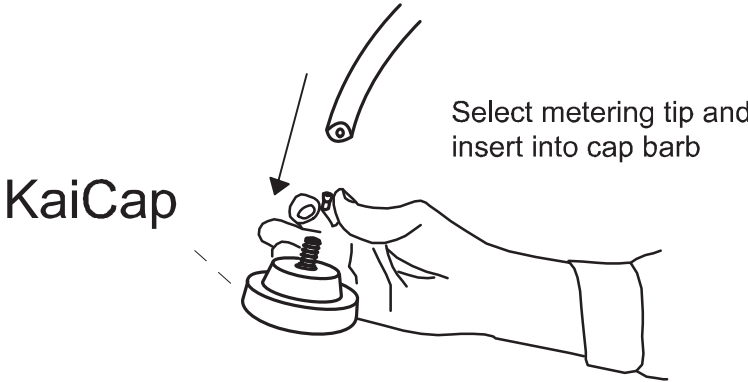

Item	Procedure
Floor Squeegee	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Check condition of rubber squeegee blades and wheels on the floor tool. Rough floor surfaces will cause the blades and wheels to wear out more quickly. Replace as necessary.
Spray Gun	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Check spray pattern. If spray pattern will not pinpoint, clean orifice by removing it with an Allen wrench and flushing. Replace if not pinpointing. * If nozzle becomes difficult to move from high to low pressure lubricate nozzle with lithium grease.
Pressure Hose	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Wipe clean after each use. * Check for cuts or frays in the hose jacket, particularly at the end of the fittings. Replace hose if cuts are found.
Water Filter	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Check filter screens for debris and clean as needed. Be careful not to crush the end of the filter screen when replacing. * Check the clear filter bowl cover to be sure it is tight. * Check for leaks around filter and filter connections.
Water Tank	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Check condition of filter in water tank. Clean as needed. * Empty the water tank to prevent mildew and bacteria growth. Empty tank by dipping the vacuum hose onto the water tank and transferring the water to the vacuum tank.
Vacuum Tank	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Empty and flush vacuum tank. * Clean and disinfect. * Check the float shutoff screen to be sure it is not plugged up. A plugged filter screen restricts airflow and results in reduced suction.
Leaks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Be alert for leaks around hoses, fittings, spray wand, tanks or elsewhere. Discontinue use until leaks are repaired.
Electrical System	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * The ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) must be tested before each use. * Electric cords must be inspected for tears or cuts in the insulation.
DVD System	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Make sure DVD player is dry and free of any debris placed on top or inside of storage compartment.

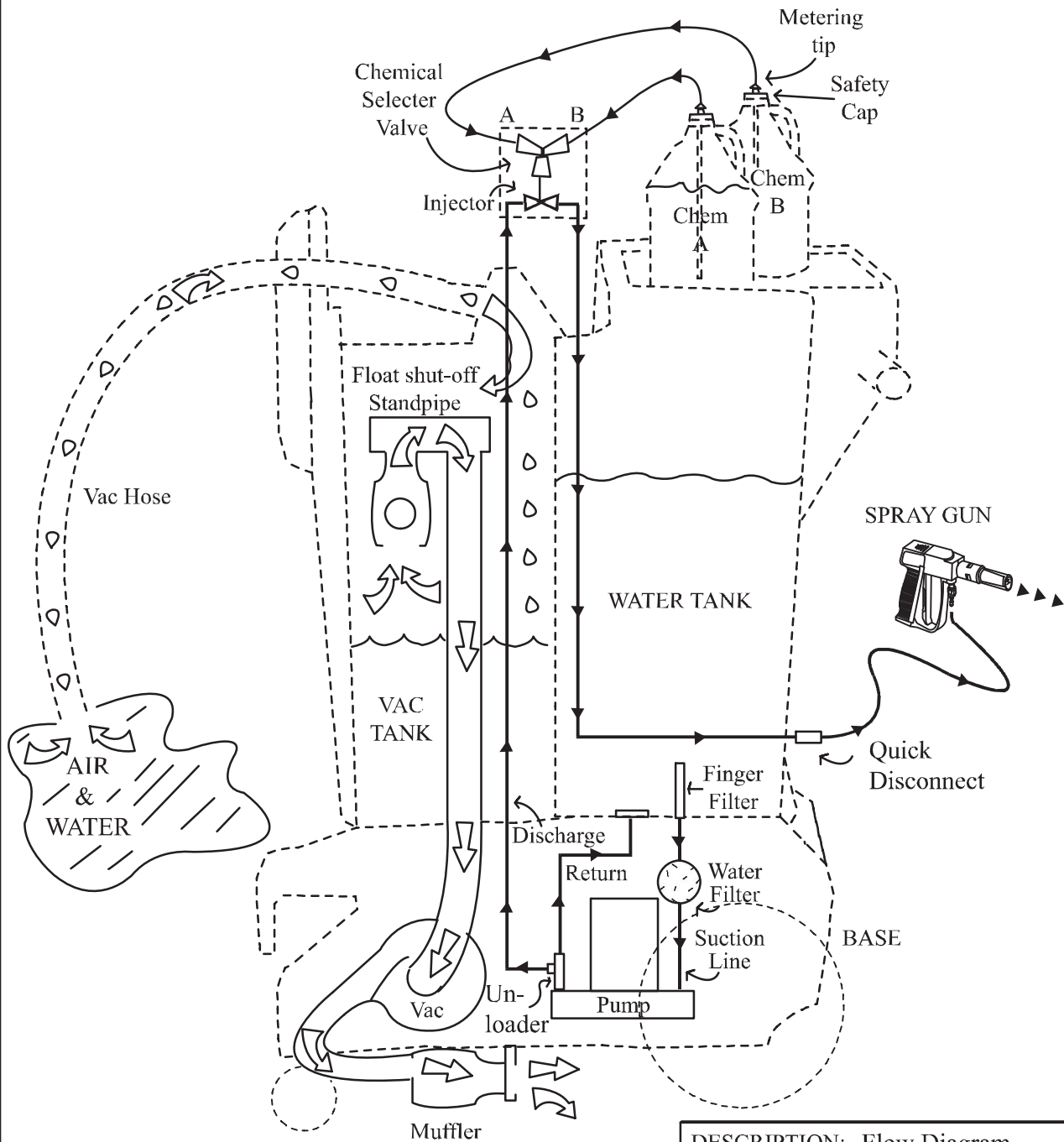

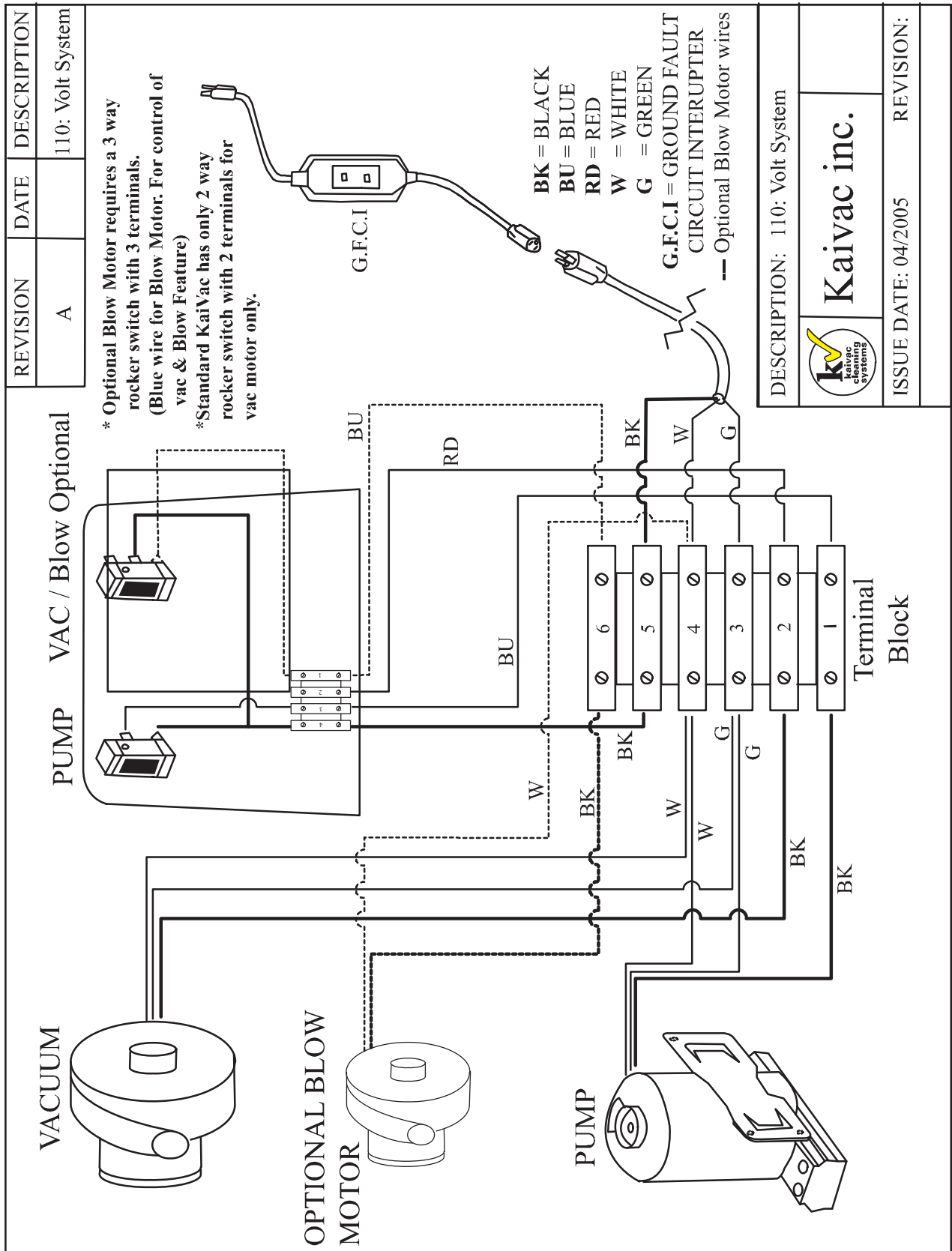
Kaivac Flow Diagram

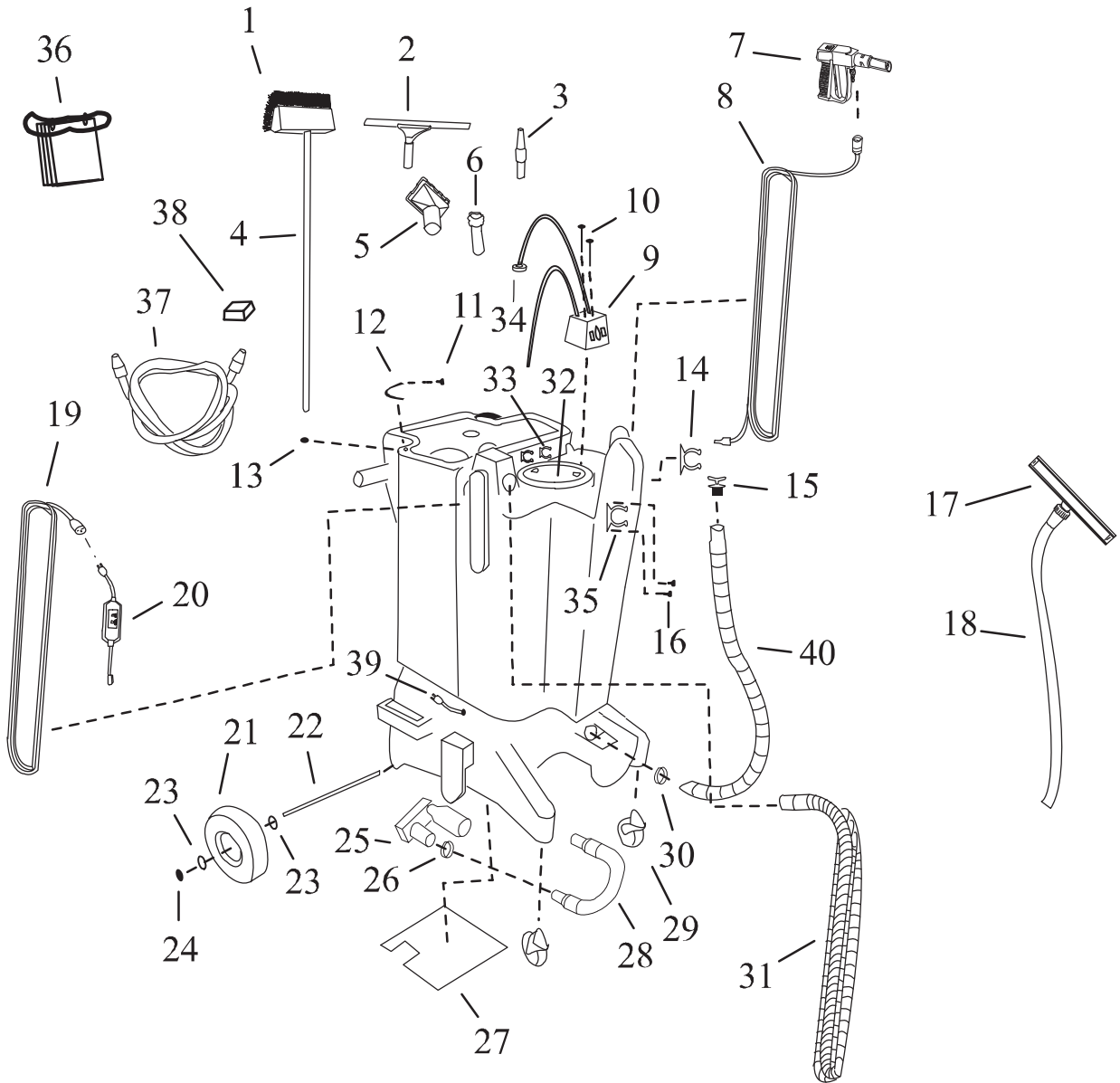

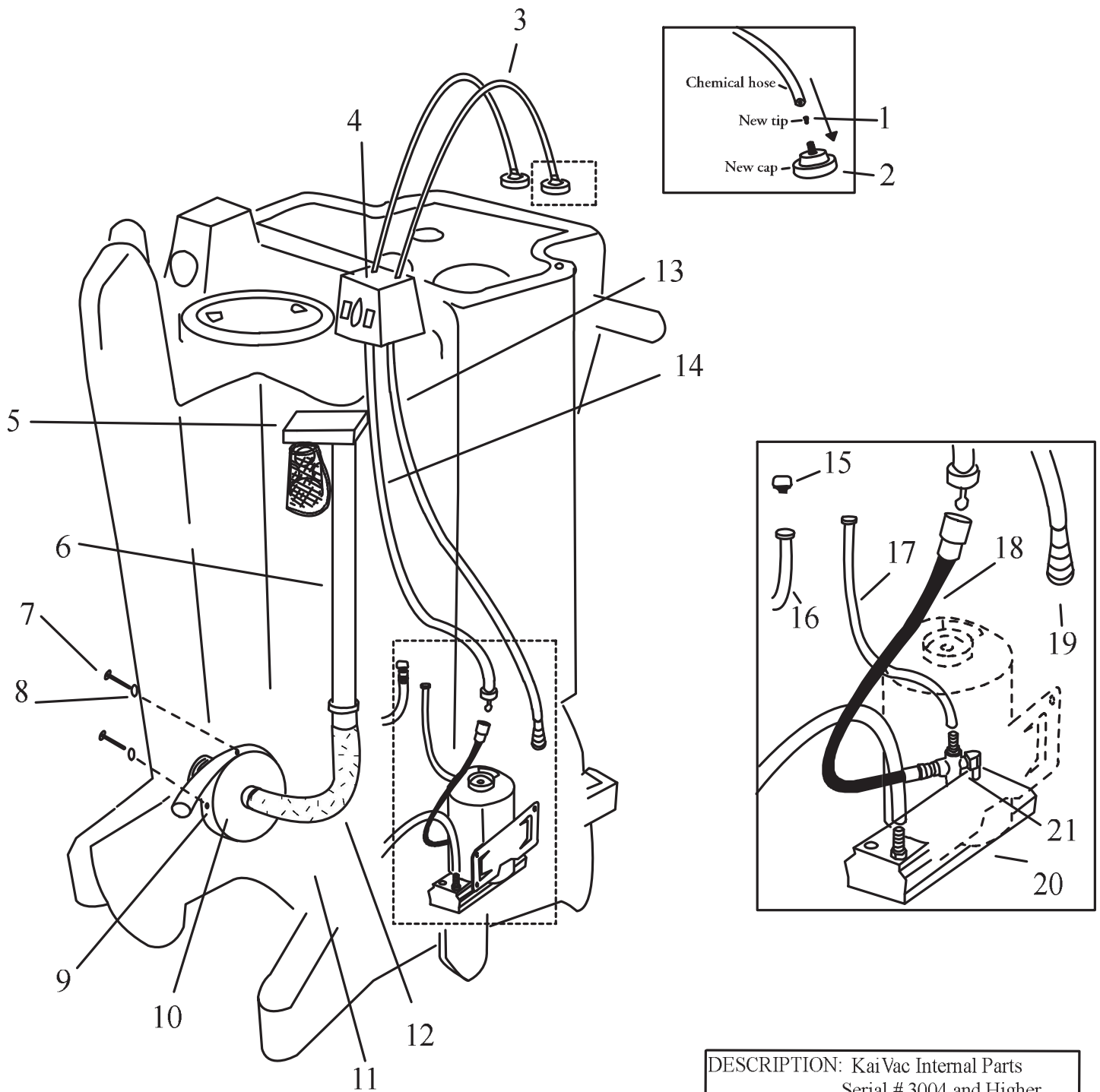
